Bible Reference Codes System

In my own personal library, I currently have thirteen notebooks full of sermon notes, a twenty-one volume set of John MacArthur's sermons, a sixteen volume set of W. Herschel Ford's sermons, Spurgeon's *Expository Encyclopedia*, Wiersbe's *Classic Sermons*, Morgan's *Westminster Pulpit*, and numerous other sermon and other collections.

I also receive and archive daily micro-commentary emails from the Institute of Creation Research, as well as occasional missives from other sources.

Several years ago, I graduated into the electronic age with the Logos, PC Bible, and BibleWorks systems, but I still need to be able to catalog and retrieve all of this "legacy" information which is stored in paper form (i.e. books) and in flat files (i.e. Microsoft Word files).

If you have similar needs, you might benefit from the Bible Reference Codes System I developed to ease searching a collection by Bible Reference. For example, suppose you have a collection of ten articles sorted by title:

If the articles are listed in a database or even in just a simple text processor, sorting them by title is straightforward, and you can then just quickly go down the alphabetized list to find the one you want. And, if you store the complete articles in separate files, with the file name equal to the article title, your operating system should *automatically* store the files in alphabetical order.

But, now look at what happens if you reorganize and re-sort the list in Bible reference order:

To find an article on a particular Bible Reference, we would prefer to have the list in Bible Reference order (i.e. Genesis first, Exodus second, etc.) rather than in strict alphabetical order.

Suppose that, instead of the actual Bible Reference, we substitute a Bible Reference Code which is both human and computer friendly:

The code is made up of four fields. Looking, for example, at the first code above:

B47-2Co006014

B47- is the first field.2Co is the second field.006 is the third field.014 is the fourth field.

The first field is made up of four characters, B (for "Bible"), a two-character book number code (01 for Genesis, 02 for Exodus, etc.) and a dash.

The second field is the common three character abbreviation of the Bible book name (Gen for Genesis, Exo for Exodus, etc.).

Together, the first and second fields make up the Code Prefix.

The third field is a three digit Chapter Number with leading zeroes (i.e. 001 for Chapter 1, 033 for Chapter 33, etc.). For books like Obadiah and Jude, which have no chapter divisions, the Code uses 001 for the Chapter Number.

The fourth field is is a three digit Verse Number with leading zeroes.

Together, the third and fourth fields make up the Code Suffix.

With this coding, reorganizing and alphabetically sorting the list in Bible Reference Code order now produces:
