General Introduction

The complete collection of New Testament Greek manuscripts of the Bible is currently listed and available, in whole or in part, in various print, software, and online publications.

It would be convenient to have a tool or utility which would provide excerpts from the complete list; selected, ordered, and presented in an arrangement specified by the user.

For example, Variant 6 b at 1 John 5:16 in [ECM4.1, p. 360] shows εἰδη appearing instead of the primary line text (ἰδη) in minuscules. 5, 33, 181, 442, 614, 623, 630, 1175, 1359, 1735, 1751, 1836, 1874, 1875, and 2541 (out of a total of 140 mss. considered by the ECM for 1 John). In this example, a researcher might find it useful to extract the list information for those minuscules and have that information presented in date order.

This project is not intended to present exhaustive manuscript information to the user. Instead, it's intended to only present simple and abbreviated identifying information in a convenient order. The user can then refer to the primary sources for more complete information as needed.

The intention of this first paper in the project is to develop a proof-of-concept database system presenting a List of New Testament Greek Papyri Manuscripts which can be re-ordered by date or manuscript number, and from which subsets can be selected via queries based on user criteria.

If this proof-of-concept proves successful, I intend to extend the query capabilities of the system to also select and sort by the contents of the mss, and by their physical locations.

I would also intend to extend the data collection beyond the Papyri to also include the other New Testament Greek mss., i.e., the Uncials, Minuscules, Lectionaries, and Amulets.

As of 2023/09/04, the mss. currently extant include:

I will be developing this project's database in Microsoft Access 2021, but I'll also present the data as semicolon-delimited text files for those who would prefer to use a different database engine.

Please note that several references within this document are abbreviated in brackets. For example, [TR] = Textus Receptus. These abbreviations are more fully described in the "Works Cited" list below.

For simplicity, papyri are simply referred to herein by P+#, rather than by $\mathfrak{T}^{i\#}$, e.g.:

P52 = \mathfrak{T}^{52} = John Rylands' early 2nd century fragment of John

Also for simplicity, all data is maintained in ASCII format, rather than in Unicode format. This facilitates the use of plain text files for data transfer, storage, and maintenance.

Chapter 01: Obtaining, Updating, and Modifying the Data

The manuscript data for this project is based on the Center for New Testament Textual Studies' NT Critical Apparatus, as updated and augmented by additional data available online.

I have this Critical Apparatus data available to me from two sources. [CNTTSB] is the older BibleWorks list. [CNTTSL] is the newer Logos Bible Software list. The information contained in these two lists is identical. I chose to use [CNTTSB] rather than [CNTTSL] simply because the Logos data includes excess spaces which would be a nuisance to remove while building the database.

The first step in this building process was to select and copy the data from the [CNTTSB] papyri list into a plain text file. I use TextPad 8.8.1 (64-bit edition) rather than NotePad or other free text processors, because of several conveniences which TextPad provides. Most important for me is the feature which keeps the cursor at the previous column location when moving from line-to-line using the up or down arrows on the keyboard. This way I can easily insert characters at the same column position on every line without having to use the back arrow - Great for modifying lengthy lists - like adding delimiting semicolons to every line.

In [CNTTSB], the papyri mss. key looks like this:

When copied to the text file, in plain ASCII format, it comes out like this:

The “(î1)”, “(î3)”, “(î4c)”, etc. are due to the “ P ” in the [CNTTSB] list not being a valid ASCII character. But these glyphs don’t actually add any meaningful information to the data, and are, therefore, simply ignored, resulting in an ASCII list which, after manually removing those mistranslated glyphs, looks like:

Note the commas in this data. That’s why I use semicolon-delimited data rather than comma-delimited data. I checked: the data for the Uncials, Minuscules, Lectionaries, and Amulets, as well as for the Papyri. None of them contain any semicolons.

For insertion into the MS Access database table, I need two fields: a short text field for the manuscript numbers, and a long text field for the manuscript descriptions. So, I manually added the semicolon-delimiters, producing:

P1; 3rd c., fragmentary papyrus ms. of Matthew, located...
P2; 6th c., fragmentary papyrus ms. of John in Greek and...
P3; 6th/7th c., fragmentary papyrus ms. of Luke, located...
P4; late 2nd c., fragmentary papyrus ms. of Luke, locate...
P4c; 3rd c. corrector most likely, fragmentary papyrus...
P5; 3rd c., fragmentary papyrus ms. of John, located in...

But, before inserting the data into the database table, a couple of housekeeping matters had to be handled.

First, the [CNTTSB] (and CNTTSL) papyri mss. key shows information for papyri P1 through P127. But that information is incomplete. New manuscript discoveries are being added to the manuscript lists all the time. As I mentioned in the General Introduction, there are currently 141 Papyri mss. extant. So, I manually added information as found in [WNTP] for P128 through P141 to the semicolon-delimited list.

Second, I compared the P1 through P127 information in [CNTTSB] with that for P1 through P127 in [WNTP]. This allowed me to manually incorporate additional and changed information to the data, as well as noting and correcting any typos or other errors. (For those who might enjoy a touch of Text Critical humor, this process is a fairly good example of “conflation”.)

Note that [CNTTSB] and [CNTTSL] generally refer to date ranges as “5th c.” (for fifth century), etc. while [WNTP] uses “400-500”, etc. instead. I decided to retain the [CNTTSB] and [CNTTSL] date format where there was no conflict. Where there *is* a conflict, e.g., for P12 where [CNTTSB] and [CNTTSL] show “early 3rd c.” and [WNTP] shows “275-300” (i.e., late

3rd c.), I show both in the text file. In such cases, I subsequently used the [WNTTP] data as the base for the DateSortCode (See Chapter 3) as more likely correct.

The complete semicolon-delimited data list for input into the database table appears in Appendix II. The file is also available, free, at:

Having arrived at this point, the next step was to simply import the Semicolon-delimited data into a new database table using the built-in Microsoft Access 2021 External Data menu and the “Advanced” function to set the semicolon-delimiter and the “Long Text” field for the description. I used the default “Short Text” for the manuscript number field. I named the database “PapyriDatabase.accdb” and the table “PapyriN”. I named the two table fields as “MS” and “DESCRIPTION”.

I allowed MS Access to automatically add an “ID” autonumber field to serve as a primary key for database efficiency.

Chapter 02: The MSSortCode Field

Having established the database in minimal preliminary form, I now added a new “MSSortCode” field to the Papyri table to allow for the sorting of Papyri data in MS order. (Although the data was already entered in MS Order, database engines do not guarantee that the data will be reported in any particular order unless that reporting order is clearly specified).

The MSSortCode field is a General Decimal Number field with Precision = 18, Scale = 6, Decimal Places = 6, and Text Align = “General”. Its entries will simply be the Papyri’s number (with a few adjustments).

For example, for MS = P1, MSSortCode = 1.

For MS = P122, MSSortCode = 122.

Some papyri manuscript entries are for corrected manuscripts which include a “c” suffix in their number. In that case, the decimal 0.03 is added to the Papyri’s number. For example:

For MS = P4c, MSSortCode = 4.03.

For MS = P115c, MSSortCode = 115.03.

The decimal 0.03 was chosen because “c” is the third letter of the alphabet.

This concept was chosen in general because the ultimate goal is to also include the Uncials, Minuscules, Lectionaries, and Amulets in the database. The Minuscules and Lectionaries, in particular, use additional suffixes, e.g., “abs”, “b”, “d”, ... “n”. This will allow entries such as:

For Minuscule MS = 1909abs, the MSSortCode would end in 1909.010219.

For Lectionary MS = 11191g, the MSSortCode would end in 1191.07

It's also intended to eventually combine all the manuscripts into one large combined table (in addition to maintaining the separate Papyri, Uncials, etc. Tables). In that combined configuration, the query ordering will be Papyri first, Uncials second, etc.

To accomplish this combined sorting, Uncial MSSortCodes will be their number + 10000, Minuscules will be their number + 20000, Lectionaries will be their number + 30000, and Amulets will be their number + 40000. For example:

For Uncial MS = 0224, MSSortCode = 10224.

For Minuscule MS = 1909abs, MSSortCode = 21909.010219.

For Lectionary MS = 1 1191g, MSSortCode = 31191.07.

For Amulet MS = T23, MSSortCode = 40023.

Following these criteria, I manually entered the MSSortCode entries throughout the Papyri table. As a test, I successfully executed the following "MSOrder" query to sort the records in the normal ascending Papyri Number Order:

```

As a further test, I successfully executed the following "MSDescendingOrder" query to sort the records in descending Papyri Number Order:

```
SELECT MS, DESCRIPTION
FROM PapyriN
ORDER BY MSSortCode DESC;
```

Chapter 03: The DateSortCode Field

I now added a new “DateSortCode” field to the Papyri table to facilitate the sorting of Papyri data in date order. The DateSortCode field is a General Decimal Number field with Precision = 18, Scale = 6, Decimal Places = 6, and Text Align = “General”. As I mentioned earlier, [WNTP] dates will be given precedence over [CNTTSB] and [CNTTSL] dates.

For dates in the DESCRIPTION field which are expressed as a specific year, I intend to use that specific year as the DateSortCode (there are no such records in the Papyri table).

For dates in the DESCRIPTION field which are expressed as two specific years, I intend to use the round-numbered year as the DateSortCode (there are no such records in the Papyri table).

For example, for a “1311/1312” date entry, DateSortCode = 1312.

For a “1516/1517” date entry, DateSortCode = 1516.

For dates in the DESCRIPTION field which are expressed as a single century, I intend to use the middle year of that century as the DateSortCode.

For example, for a “4th c.” date entry (since the 4th century = 301 to 400 A.D.), I will use DateSortCode = 350.

For dates in the DESCRIPTION field which are expressed as two consecutive centuries, I intend to use the center year of that two-century period as the DateSortCode.

For example, for a “6th/7th c.” date entry (since the period in question = 501 to 700 A.D.), I will use DateSortCode = 600.

And, in general, I will try to use the center year of whatever date entry period is expressed in the DESCRIPTION field. I will generally ignore non-definitive approximation

qualifiers such as “ca.” And “possibly”. But I will consider definitive approximation qualifiers to indicate a specific period, e.g., “early 5th c.” = 401 to 450 A.D., and “very early 5th c.” = 401 to 425 A.D.

Following these criteria, I manually entered the DateSortCode entries throughout the Papyri table.

Some Specific Entry Notes:

P4 = “late 2nd c.”; Period = 151 to 200 A.D.; DateSortCode = 175.

P4c = “3rd c. Corrector...”; Period = 201-300 A.D.; DateSortCode = 250.

P7 = “3rd to 4th c.”; Period = 201 to 400 A.D.; DateSortCode = 300.

P12 = “([WNTTP] shows 275-300); DateSortCode = 288

P23 = “very early 3rd c.”; DateSortCode = 212.

P137 = “150-250”; DateSortCode = 200.

As a test, I successfully executed the following “DateOrder” query to sort the records in the ascending DateSortCode Order:

```
SELECT MS, DESCRIPTION
FROM PapyriN
ORDER BY DateSortCode, MSSortCode;
```

Since more than one record can have the same DateSortCode; within each DateSortCode sub-collection, I further sort the records in MSSortCode order.

In order to more easily check the correctness of the manual DateSortCode entries, I successfully executed the following “DateOrderCheck” query to sort the records in the ascending DateSortCode Order with the DateSortCode field showing:

```
SELECT MS, DateSortCode, DESCRIPTION
FROM PapyriN
ORDER BY DateSortCode, MSSortCode;
```

As a further test, I successfully executed the following “DateDescendingOrderCheck” query to sort the records in descending DateSortCode Order:

```
SELECT MS, DateSortCode, DESCRIPTION
FROM PapyriN
ORDER BY DateSortCode DESC, MSSortCode;
```

Finally, suppose we were looking at a (fictitious here) selection of scripture, and a particular variant’s witnesses included P4c, P28, P36, P110c, and P128. We would execute the “Variants” query:

```
SELECT MS, DESCRIPTION
FROM PapyriN
WHERE MS = ‘P4c’
OR MS = ‘P28’
OR MS = ‘P36’
OR MS = ‘P110c’
OR MS = ‘P128’
ORDER BY DateSortCode, MSSortCode;
```

and obtain the results:

```
P4c    3rd c. corrector most likely...
P28    3rd c., fragmentary papyrus...
P110c  4th c. corrector most likely...
P36    6th c., fragmentary papyrus ms....
P128   6th/7th c., fragmentary papyrus...
```

which are exactly as expected.

Note that the MS entries in the query are enclosed in single quotes, not double quotes.

After adding these two sort code fields, I exported the Papyri table to a semicolon delimited text file which is presented in Appendix III. That file is also available, free, at <https://www.theologyfrombelow.org/files/Books/MSSLLists/PapyriOut.zip> .

Conclusions and Future Work

The intention of this first paper in the Manuscript Lists Database project was to develop a proof-of-concept database system presenting a List of New Testament Greek Papyri Manuscripts which can be re-ordered by date or manuscript number, and from which subsets can be selected via queries based on user criteria.

This paper documents the fact that this proof-of-concept database system has indeed proved to be successful.

The next steps in the future of this project will be to:

1. Add “City”, “State”, and “Country” fields to the Papyri table to allow for selecting and sorting by manuscript location. No attempt will be made to sort by specific institution at this time.

2. Add “Mat”, “Mar”, “Luk”, ..., “1Co”, “2Co”, ..., “3Jo”, “Jud”, and “Rev” fields to the Papyri table to allow for selecting and sorting by manuscript book contents. No attempt will be made to select or sort by chapter or verse at this time.

3. Add an “Uncials” table including MSSortCode, DateSortCode, and location and contents fields similar to those in the Papyri table.

4. Add a “Minuscules” table including MSSortCode, DateSortCode, and location and contents fields similar to those in the Papyri table.

5. Add a “Lectionaries” table including MSSortCode, DateSortCode, and location and contents fields similar to those in the Papyri table.

6. Add an “Amulets” table including MSSortCode, DateSortCode, and location and contents fields similar to those in the Papyri table.

7. Collect the Papyri, Uncials, Minuscules, Lectionaries, and Amulets tables into one “CombinedMSSLists” table to facilitate selecting and sorting from within the entire corpus as a whole.
